

# Enough Project Information Leaflet for beneficiaries

## I was aggressed by somebody. Am I a victim of racially motivated violence?

You are a victim of racially motivated violence if you have been attacked, threatened, intimidated, or insulted because of your

- Origin, and/or
- Nationality, and/or
- colour, and/or
- ethnicity, and/or
- religion

### Forms of racially motivated violence that can be prosecuted include:

- Verbal violence against you or your relatives: offenses, swearing, menaces or intimidations;
- Physical violence: body harm, injuries, beating up with or without the use of arms or any other tool or blunt instrument (for example knife, bottle, baton, chain, tazer, hammer, wrench etc), rape, sexual violence;
- Damage to your home or properties (for example smashing doors or windows, writing offences on your properties)
- Entering your properties or disturbing domestic peace
- Threat of attack, including offensive letters, abusive or obscene telephone calls, groups hanging around to intimidate, and/or unfounded malicious complaints

### Who can be the aggressor?

Anybody: one person or a group of persons, including the police or any other authority/civil servant.

### Where can this happen?

Anywhere: in the street, in bars or other public places, in your house, at school, at work, in police stations or detention centers, in hospitals, in public offices and other places.

### When?

Anytime but you should act as soon as possible. If it happened within the last 3 months, you can report it to us.

### I think I am a victim. Can I get any help?

Racially motivated violence is illegal. Aggressors can be denounced and punished. If such an incident happens to you, you should:

- Try to gather and remember all details of the aggression: where it happened, when it happened, how it happened, what did they do to you or your relatives, who aggressed you, if there was any witnesses who could be contacted, if the aggressors had a car or motorbike, try to see and remember the plate.
- Report as soon as possible the case to MDM and GCR and other organizations that can help you.
- Report the case to any public prosecutor accompanied by a lawyer or call the number 11414 and for more information please refer to us.



At Mediciens du Monde and the Greek Council for Refugees, you can receive medical help, social assistance and see a lawyer, who can advise on the procedure to be followed and help you if you want to lodge a complaint at the Prosecutor.

We are in Athens, if you have been a victim of racist attack or an eye witness come to see us.
